Employees of area businesses combine work release time with volunteer time to tutor K-12 and Adult Basic Education students with enrichment or remedial activities, speak to classrooms about curriculum relevant topics and work with students on special projects involving their company's area of expertise. Listed below are programs that are currently in need of more volunteers.

**Junior Achievement:** Be involved in an in-school program that helps students understand and apply economics to everyday life, and learn about career opportunities. Junior Achievement's sequential and integrated kindergarten through grade 12 programs help young people use information, apply basic skills, think critically, and solve complex problems. All class materials are provided by Junior Achievement, including training sessions for first-time instructors. The lesson plans are instructor friendly and easy to teach. We are asking community members to share their time, up to an hour per week for five weeks. Volunteers are needed in all Woodbury schools.

**Classroom Tutors:** Volunteers are needed in all elementary schools to work one on one or with small groups of elementary students helping students to master basic language and math concepts through hands on games or by

listening to them read aloud. You do not need to be an expert teacher to volunteer for this program, just know the ABC's and how to count to ten. Guidance is provided by the classroom teacher. Adults in this program are needed on a weekly basis and should be willing to spend 30 to 45 minutes a week helping young students master the basics.

**Math Tutors:** Volunteers are also need to help tutor junior high and high school students in math before or after school for 30 minutes to an hour a week. Tutoring is needed in algebra, geometry and advanced algebra.
